Providing a "Hand Up" not just a "hand out"

The Mission is a 501(c)(3) charity helping the poor and homeless in our community. This is made possible through the providence of caring donors, and the hard work of staff, guests, and volunteers.



The Manager of Mission Cleaning Supply found a new life at the Mission. He came to us several years ago homeless and having made many bad life choices. This man is now using his talents for the Glory of God.

The Mission provides...

Shelter and guidance for a Better Life:

- Safe, free accommodations on a drug/alcohol-free campus
- Shelter intake Mon-Fri, Noon to 3pm
- Separate dorms for men and women; family rooms for women with children
- Short-term or long-term stay (over a year) based on individual/family situations
- Case manager assigned for guests staying more than a few days
- Guests can leave anytime; may be required to leave for rule violations
- Rules include:... kind and respectful behavior, daily chores, Chapel attendance, drug/alcohol screenings as needed, adherence to schedules, etc.
- Guests contribute to the Mission by doing chores, mentored by trained staff.

Food Security for the Community:

- 365 days/year: meals served (7am, Noon, 5pm) by food safety certified staff and guests.
- Meals for shelter guests, plus "to-go" meals at front gate for anyone hungry.
- Provide excess food to partnering food banks around community (minimal spoilage)
- New "House Of Mercy" (H.O.M) will provide hot meals to people on the street (currently sack lunches). Plus H.O.M. to provide extreme weather sheltering s (e.g. freezing nights).

Clothing Serving Those in Need:

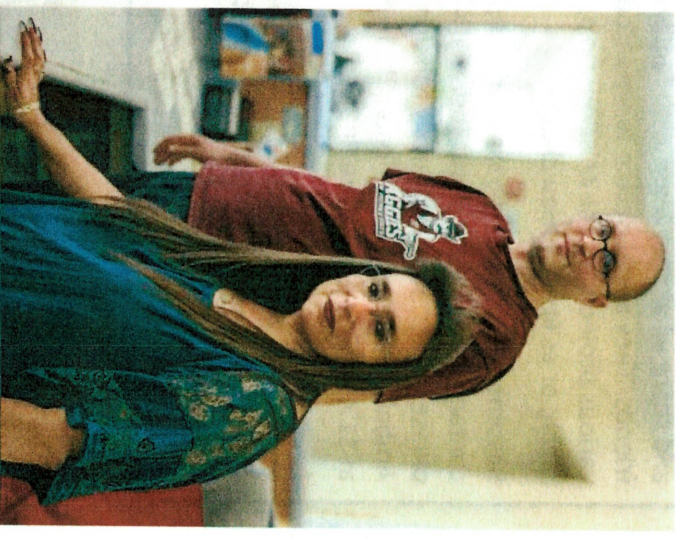
- Free clothing closet for shelter guests.
- Coats, blankets provided at front gate for those on the street.
- Clothes given to partner organizations for distribution.
- 100% of profits of thrift store help fund Mission food and shelter operations.

Productive Work:

- Case managers facilitate guests finding and keeping external employment.
- Half of our paid staff are prior homeless people that became long term guests then staff.
- Rock of Ages Thrift Store and Mission Cleaning Supply provide vocational training; recoup costs; and contribute to Mission's services budget.

Staff (former and current guests) manage the Shelter operations including intake process, health, security, chore assignments, conflict resolution, and maintain a drug/alcohol free facility.
